# **Using Commas in Addresses**

# **Key Terms**

• address: the place where a home or business is located

• envelope: a flat paper in which you put a letter to mail

#### Instruction

Sometimes when you fill out a form or write a letter to someone, you might need to refer to an **address**. This is where a person lives or a business is located.

When you write an address, it is important to use correct punctuation. There are two rules for using commas in addresses: the Sentence Rule and the Envelope Rule.

### The Sentence Rule

If you use an address in a sentence, you must use two commas. The first comma goes after the street address, such as 100 Hope Street. The second comma goes in between the state and city part of the address, such as New York, NY. Look at the sample below and circle the two commas.

Lucia lives at 100 Hope Street, New York, NY 12345.

### The Envelope Rule

When you write an address on an **envelope** to mail a letter, you use only one comma. It goes in between the city and state. You do not put a comma at the end of the full street address, as you do for the sentence rule. Look at the envelope from Lucia's grandmother below. Notice where the comma is used. Circle the comma.
